Commentary

It is with heartfelt thanks and appreciation that I, along with a talented group of news collectors, translators and technical experts, take the reins of the Section on Archives and Human Rights newsletter. Generative AI is a powerful technology that can create realistic and engaging content, such as text, images, audio and video. Termed “synthetic media” by some experts, AI-generated content can be a powerful tool for human rights advocacy and education.

However, it also poses serious challenges for the integrity of information and the protection of human rights. Misinformation and disinformation can undermine public trust, social cohesion and democratic processes. How can we ensure that the information we create, consume and preserve is trustworthy and accurate, especially when it can be manipulated or fabricated by generative AI?

The UN's June 2023 report on [Information Integrity on Digital Platforms](#) does not pull any punches: "The ability to disseminate large-scale disinformation to undermine scientifically established facts poses an existential risk to humanity (A/75/982, para. 26) and endangers democratic institutions and fundamental human rights. These risks have further intensified because of rapid advancements in technology, such as generative artificial intelligence". We can see the effects worldwide, including in France, where [media reported](#) that the French government had "uncovered a major Russian disinformation campaign, with false news items hostile to Ukraine made to look like they were published by prominent French news media."

[Human Rights Watch has reported](#) that "Exploitation of workers in the creation of AI is another key human rights issue...OpenAI outsourced its data labeling for ChatGPT to Sama, a company that employed workers in Kenya to work in grueling conditions, some paid less than \$2 an hour for sifting through toxic and biased data."

While the benefits and risks of generative AI will evolve with the technology, it is clear that the continued use of generative AI will need oversight by a variety of technologists, ethicists, content creators, human rights defenders, and archivists.
